The Benelux Union

To celebrate our new branding and our commitment to the environment, Lexmark donated 50 ginkgo biloba trees to resellers in the union.

Budapest, Hungary



Lexmark Budapest employees painted fences, tidied up pavements and cleaned up the surrounding areas at the Budakeszi Wildlife Park and Noé Animal Shelter, providing approximately 400 hours of service.



Lexmark Budapest volunteers welcomed socially disadvantaged children from the Burattino School on Children's Island.

Employees in Budapest also participated in a "Make It Happen Day" with the AmCham Foundation. They donated a printer to the Bolyai Children's Home and helped with the Home's garden.

Orleans, France

Lexmark Orleans sponsored the 15th edition of the Open Tennis Handisport du Loiret. Lexmark is a long-standing sponsor of this national tournament, which aims to make wheelchair tennis available to people of all abilities.



In 2015, Lexmark employees joined forces to collect money to send a multifunction product to the Maban region in South Sudan. Lexmark's donation will be used to print textbooks and school material for refugee children and adults attending Jesuit Refugee Service schools. These schools provide education for the 130,000 refugees of this African war zone. Thanks to the collaboration with DHL France, the printer reached South Sudan and will aid South Sudanese teachers in educating the next generation.

Geneva, Switzerland

As part of the eco-contract signed between Terre des Hommes Suisse and the city of Geneva, Lexmark collected old cell phones. Terre des Hommes Suisse received up to 3 CHF for each collected

mobile phone. The money will be used by the organization to finance development projects in Africa, Latin America and Asia.

Additionally, Lexmark employees in Geneva conducted a drive to collect clothing for Caritas in an effort to help the impoverished and socially disadvantaged in their communities.

Milan, Italy



Lexmark employees volunteered to be a point of reference for visitors of Expo Milano 2015. They provided support for those in need of special attention and care, such as children, mothers with children and the elderly. They also welcomed visitors with foreign language support and with their focus on diversity throughout the event.
